

## **Auschwitz Birkenau Group Tour and Evening Concert with Dinner**

Visit Auschwitz and Birkenau in our morning tour and in the evening acquaint yourself with Jewish culture in Krakow at a concert in Jewish Cafe Klezmer.

You will meet your vehicle and guide for the 150km round trip to the UNESCO site of the Auschwitz Birkenau Memorial Museum near the town of Oswiecim. The Auschwitz and Birkenau Camps were set up in 1940 originally for prisoners from Poland. From 1942 it became one of the biggest extermination camps for the European Jews , more than 1 million men, women and children lost their lives there including Jews, Poles, Gypsies, POWs and other nationalities. After the Second World War the camp was established by the Polish Government as The Auschwitz-Birkenau Memorial Museum and since then has visitors from all over the world. The basic structures of both camps have survived and permanent exhibitions have been set up in some of the buildings of the main Auschwitz site which include documents and historical exhibits such as furniture and clothing, and displays of personal belongings. The exhibitions are one of the main elements of the visit and explain life and death in the camps. After your visit to the Auschwitz and Birkenau site your guide and vehicle return you to Krakow. Your guide in the morning tour will have passed to you your tickets for the evening concert of Jewish, Russian and gypsy music in the heart of the Jewish Quarter, Concert starts at 8pm. You can make your own way to the Cafe Kezmer Hois where you will present your tickets and be shown to your reserved table.
